Notice Regarding Typhoon Damage in the Philippines (2)  
Progress of disclosure items

In response to the recent typhoon damage in the Philippines, TOYOFLEX CEBU CORPORATION (Cebu Factory), a consolidated subsidiary, has suspended operations since December 16, 2021, but is scheduled to partially resume operations on January 14, 2022.

1. Status of restoration

As reported in the press release "Notice Regarding Typhoon Damage in the Philippines" dated December 20, 2021, TOYOFLEX CEBU CORPORATION (hereafter referred to as "Cebu Factory") of Asahi Intecc Group has been shut down since December 16, 2021 due to the impact of the 22<sup>nd</sup> typhoon. However, due to the partial restoration of electricity supply in the island of Mactan where the Cebu Factory is located, the factory will partially resume its operation.

With regard to the Medical Division, there was no serious damage from the beginning, but with the resumption of power supply, the business is scheduled to resume operations on or around January 14, 2022.

As for the Device Division, most of the buildings of several production factories have been damaged. We are currently in the process of restoring the buildings and confirming the operation of machinery and equipment, and plan to resume operations in stages from around January 20, 2022.

However, it is expected to take some time to fully resume operations.

We will continue to work towards the resumption of full-scale operations, and we ask for your continued support.

2. Impact on operating results

There is no significant impact on our group's overall business performance for the fiscal year due to the typhoon damage.
